

Press Release*** The Warren County Collector and Warren County Assessor are sending this press release out to alert Warren County Taxpayers of the possible increases to your Personal Property Bill for 2022. This is due to disruptions in the production of new vehicles, computer chip shortages, and loss of labor forces to produce parts. The used auto market has increased in demand and value due to the loss of available brand-new vehicles. According to news outlets, used automobile prices have surged anywhere from 20 to 40% , depending on the make, model, and availability of certain vehicles, especially trucks. The Assessor's office is mandated by state statute (RsMO 137.115) to use the October 1st, 2021 N.A.D.A. value guide. These values have shown an increase from the prior tax year due to the conditions stated above. Unfortunately, these factors will have an effect on your tax statement. Two examples are a 2012 Ford F150 supercab in 2021 had a Value of 3260 and tax amount of \$195.84; in 2022 that same vehicle is valued at 4530 and \$270.01. A 2017 GMC Yukon in 2021 was valued at 11,240 and tax amount of \$699.21; in 2022 that same vehicle is valued at 13,480 and taxed at \$833.25. Tax bills are being sent out Friday the 4th, please look your bill over and verify that the information is correct. If you don't receive your bill by Thanksgiving please call the Warren County Collector Office at 636-456-3330. Please be aware that December 31st is on a Saturday this year, our offices will not be open, so please pay early to avoid having penalties and interest added to your bill . A December 31st postmark from the Post Office will be honored. Go to the Post Office to guarantee your postmark. If placed in your mail box you may not be guaranteed the December 31st postmark.
